Our Town has undertaken some changes this year. We now have committees in place to help clean up our Town and bring it to another level. We urge all property owners to take pride in our community and keep your properties neat and tidy.

We have repaired some roads and paved others; that has always cost extra money every year. We will continue to repair and pave roads next year.

We did a complete renovation of our War Memorial, which was cost shared with Veterans Affairs. Phase 1 is now complete and we hope to complete phase 2 next year.

We purchased another ambulance. Our ambulances are now secure for another six or seven years.

As you will notice, our old tree is gone, it outlived its usefulness. A new one has been installed. The Salvation Army will be along to help us ring in the Christmas Season. A snack will be provided.
