Over the past year, we have repaired many water leaks; with our weakened infrastructure this will always pose a problem. Our water treatment plant has been keeping up pleasantly well. We have upgraded some of the pumps, replaced the sand filters, and a new computer system has been installed.

Our Ambulance Service is kept bust at all times. When you call the emergency line, don't forget to give your telephone number and keep the line clear as an ambulance attendant will call you back. This will speed up the process in responding to your call.

Once again, we are pleased to announce that we will be holding our annual "Pack the Back." On Saturday December 16th from 9 AM to 4 PM, non perishable food items and items for all ages will be collected for the Salvation Army Corps in Green's Harbour to help local families. We would like to thank everyone that supported this important charity in the past.
